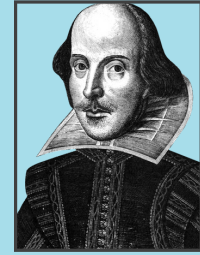




MOVERS AND SHAKERS

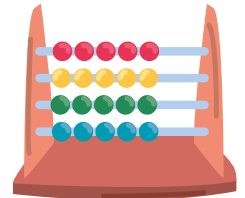

Driver Subject: **Geography**

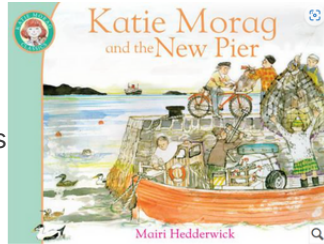
This project teaches children about the physical and human features of coastal regions across the United Kingdom, including a detailed exploration of the coastal town of Whitby, in Yorkshire.

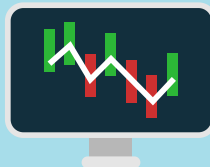

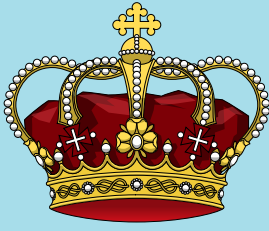

Driver Subject: **History**

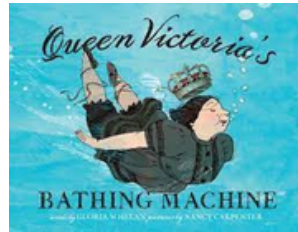

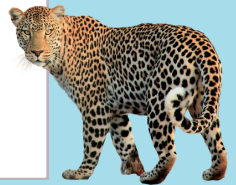

DESIGN & TECHNOLOGY
